recommending lots and lots of books. but I don't always get to recommend middle grade fiction. Breakout by Kate Messner is a great read that tackles the complex themes of race, class, privilege and oppression in the United States in an audience-appropriate manner. This book is filled with action and emotion and is told in such a creative way. Nora Tucker is looking forward to a great summer vacation in Wolf Creek. but when two inmates from the nearby maximum security prison break out, everything changes! Suddenly, a summer that is supposed to be filled with fun and popsicles turns into a summer filled with suspicion and a manhunt! This story is told in an epistolary format that uses letters, poems, text messages, news stories, comics, song lyrics, and even a recipe to tell the story. Recommended for ages 10 and up!




