





THE BOOKS WE'RE MOST EXCITED ABOUT THIS MONTH:






FRESH INSPIRATIONAL FICTION





With each recipe she makes, Nikki not only discovers her heritage but also learns to reconnect with what has been scattered.



Isabel Dalhousie lives a quiet life. As the editor of the *Journal of Applied Ethics*, she wrestles with moral questions both large and small, but much of her work is theoretical. When she witnesses the death of a young man at her local theater, she feels compelled to learn more. Can a philosopher use her scholarly skills to solve a potential murder? Set in the rainy world of Edinburgh, Scotland, this is the first book in a series of beautifully rendered mysteries by master Alexander McCall Smith. The author has an amazing ability to transcend genre, using mystery as a literary form to comment on the joys and sorrows of our shared humanity. If you are interested in a page-turning thriller, these books are not for you. But if you love an atmospheric and character driven piece of literature, you're sure to enjoy these graceful mysteries.

LIBRARY NEWS

HOW THE HOOPLA APP WORKS

Hoopla is a wonderful service provided by the library that offers library card holders ebooks, e-audiobooks, tv shows, music, and movies! But Hoopla works differently than a traditional online library collection. Instead of buying each individual item, the library pays each time a patron accesses an item. So, if you visit Hoopla and check out an e-audio that will probably cost the library about \$1.99. There are a lot of advantages to this system! Because the library doesn't have to purchase each individual item, there are many more available- over half a million! Hoopla also allows library patrons to check out the same item at the same time- no holds or wait times. The disadvantage comes in managing the budget for Hoopla. Because the library pays each time a patron accesses an item we have a daily cap so the library doesn't go over budget. When a patron sees a message like "You have exceeded the daily/monthly limit" that is what the message means. The library has spent its daily budget for Hoopla items. The library's current budget for Hoopla for the year is \$10,000. This works out to \$27.40 a day or roughly a dozen checkouts a day. There is a limit of 3 items per person a month to ensure that checkouts are evenly dispersed among library patrons. We are glad to offer this great service and would love to expand it someday.

BOOK CLUB CORNER

Fourth Wing by Rebecca Yarros - Enter the brutal and elite world of a war college for dragon riders... Everyone at Basgiath War College has an agenda—because once you enter, there are only two ways out: *graduate or die*.

Wedding Dress Sewing Circle by Jennifer Ryan - Three plucky women lift the spirits of home-front brides in wartime Britain, where clothes rationing leaves little opportunity for pomp or celebration—even at weddings—in this heartwarming novel based on true events.
