LIBRARY NEWS

THE LIBRARY AND FEDERAL FUNDS. With the passing of the "The One Big Beautiful Bill Act" some of you have had questions about the library and federal funds. In Michigan, federal funds pay for statewide services like Mel.org and the MelCat book sharing service. The Cadillac Wexford Public Library (CWPL) does not receive federal funds directly. As of right now, the money that funds MelCat and Mel.org is secure through September 30, 2026 but we do not know what will happen after that. The "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" calls for the elimination of the Institute of Museum and Library Services, the office which distributes federal funds to libraries. We do know that without federal funds, Mel.org and the MelCat can not continue in their current forms. These services may have to be reduced or eliminated entirely. CWPL is dedicated to serving our communities and we will always strive to do the best we can with the resources available to us.


