



If you are into historical fiction, time travel, woman empowerment, libraries, and love - this is the book for you. Alice Hoffman's The Invisible Hour tells the tale of Mia, a girl that was brought up in a strict commune in rural Massachusetts. As she grows older, she discovers her deep desire for freedom from the environment that oppresses her. Upon a secret visit to the local library, she discovers The Scarlet Letter, and everything changes for her. She finds that Nathaniel Hawthorne's tale mirrors the lives of the women in the commune. After the death of her mother, Mia runs away to the only people she can trust to keep her safe: the librarians. Mia has broken away from life in the commune, but she finds that she cannot escape from her mother's husband - and commune leader, Joel. Where will she go? Perhaps into the arms of her beloved author? How can that be? It is suspenseful, heart-breaking, and

full of love. I highly recommend it.







Spinning Silver is about Miryem, the daughter of a money lender who prefers to lend money as opposed to collecting it. As her family falls into poverty, Miryem takes over her fathers business and collects the money owed to her father. As she successfully collects what is due, Miryem gains a far reaching reputation that eventually catches the attention of the fey. I really loved reading this book! Its story felt like one you could find in an Aesop's fairy tale, but from the perspective of the characters instead of a narrator. While Spinning Silver's main story centers around Miryem, it does take the point of view of other central characters. I know I'm not a big fan of more than two POVs. but I think Novik uses the multiple POVs excellently to fully develop the plot and give an enjoyable depth to the characters of her story. Spinning Silver has a good pace to it. It isn't too fast to be confusing, nor is it too slow. And the beginning doesn't take forever to establish the world building and get the main plot moving. I would recommend the reading age to be 16+ for some of the mature content (abusive parent, marriage) although don't worry, there isn't anything graphic.

An unforgettable novel that spans four Christmases (1914-1918), **Last Christmas in Paris** by Hazel Gaynor and Heather Webb explores the ruins of war, the strength of love, and the enduring hope of the Christmas season.
