Although this book is a bit older, the information is timeless. I enjoy scanning through any medicinal herbal books but this one stood out to me for a few reasons. There are about 85 herbs (some edible and common foods) reviewed and the color photos really help with identifying the plants which is extremely important. The photos include most parts of the plant and also a black and white drawing of it from tip to root. The character and actions of each plant is most useful to herbalists. I found that helpful, but I thought it could've been a little bolder or bigger print, as it was hard to find on each page. The beginning part of the book goes into great detail showing the history of medicinal plants and the last section is categorized according to body ailments (including an entire section on children's complaints). Overall, I will be checking this book many more times as I learn to use plants for medicine effectively.


