STAFF PICK: Jayne SOMETIMES I AM HOT LAVA BY JODY JENSEN SHAFFER

Most of the time, Buddy is a regular kid. He has his ups and downs. But when things don't go his way, he can feel the lava bubble and boil inside himself until he erupts like a volcano! An incident at the playground causes Buddy to blow (even his dark hair turns red!)! He notices that his outburst scares his little sister and that he needs to calm down. Sitting under a tree and doing deep breathing does the trick for him. The back of the book has ideas for recognizing your body's cues that something is bothering you and you're getting angry, ready to erupt. There are multiple tips for calming down, with illustrations for taking a "volcano breath." The author also uses the correct terms for volcanic activity (molten rock, magma, Earth's core, etc.) so it can be paired with a science lesson as well. I feel the story itself is cute and the tips for a child with "volcanic" episodes are practical and useful.

LIBRARY NEWS


