### **BOOK CLUB CORNER**

Happy New Year! I don't know about you, but the beginning of the year always gets me excited for new books. Book Clubs that are registered with CWPL have a lot of new sets to choose from:

**Crossroads** by Jonathan Franzen – Literary fiction taking place in the 1970s. This book is filled with vivid characters in a compelling multigenerational tale.

**Dead Romantics** by Ashley Poston –A disillusioned millennial ghostwriter who, quite literally, has some ghosts of her own, has to find her way back home.

**All Systems Red** by Martha Wells – Beginning of the Murderbot seriesslim volume, quick and satisfying Sci Fi read.

**Sanctuary** by Paola Mendoza and Abby Sher – A fast-paced, gripping dystopian drama that amplifies the undocumented immigrant experience.

**Yellow Wife** by Sadeqa Johnson – Fully immersive story that follows an enslaved woman forced to barter love and freedom while living in the most infamous slave jail in Virginia.

**Iron Lake** by William Kent Krueger – First book in his very popular Cork O'Connor mystery series. A judge is dead and a young boy is missing. Corruption reeks at every corner. Is it all connected? Who is to blame?
