A rollicking murder mystery set in a seaside town filled with pirate lore, family secrets, unforgiveable grudges, secret societies, and of course, a treasure lost to time.





In the summer of 1927, the Dole Air Race took place - a crossing of the Pacific Ocean, 2,400 miles from California to Hawaii. One of the pilots wanting to take the challenge is young Olivia "Livy" West. Livy soon finds that her aspirations for qualifying are crushed because only men will be chosen. Fortunately, her experience as a skilled navigator ensures a place with one of the pilots on this arduous journey.

The thrill of the adventure, combined with the factual accounting of the dangerous Pacific air race, keeps readers enthralled to the very end of this historical fiction novel. I love aviation and have been enamored with it my entire life. The Uncharted Flight of Olivia West by Sara Ackerman gave me chills and thrills and if you enjoy airplanes and stories of perseverance, this book is for you.
