STAFF PICK: Ashton THE DEEP DARK by Molly Knox Ostertag

The Deep Dark is a title so ambiguous that I had to try it. When I saw it on our shelves and flipped through it, the art style hooked me thoroughly! I loved it. Between the dark grayscale style intertwined with colorful memories and a mysterious secret mentioned in the blurb, I needed to read it. Boy, was I surprised by the story. The Deep Dark is a romance fiction graphic novel that deals with loss and how someone manages it. The main character, Mags, feeling as though she needs to help everyone but herself, falls into the trap of self-sabotaging. With her secret on the verge of being exposed and her responsibilities piling up, a familiar face comes to the rescue, showing her that "its ok to not be ok". This story absolutely captivated me, keeping me on the edge on my seat the whole way through. Between the mystery and love triangles, I just couldn't put it down! A great read, even if you're not into romance, perfect for teens or adults.
