



You can also check out digital ebooks and eaudiobooks from the Hoopla app. In this app, there is no waiting for your books. Instead, you have three borrows a month.

March is reading month, but who am I kidding? Every month is reading month for me! Book Clubs have been busy reading great books this year. Here are a few more new sets to get on the waiting list for:

The Last Thing He Told Me by Laura Dave - A fast-moving, heartfelt thriller about the sacrifices we make for the people we love most.

So Many Beginnings by Bethany C. Morrow - Four young Black sisters come of age during the American Civil War in <u>So Many Beginnings</u>, a warm and powerful YA remix of the classic novel <u>Little Women</u>.

The Girl in His Shadow by Audrey Blake - An unforgettable historical fiction novel about one woman who believed in scientific medicine before the world believed in her. This book is an exquisitely detailed journey through the harrowing field of medicine in mid-19th century London.

Secrets of a Charmed Life by Susan Meissner - The author of <u>A Bridge</u> <u>Across the Ocean and The Last Year of the War</u> journeys from the present day to World War II England, as two sisters are separated by the chaos of wartime.
