

THE BOOKS WE'RE MOST EXCITED ABOUT THIS MONTH:







A GENTLEMAN IN MOSCOW by Amor Towles



In my continuing quest to discover enjoyable reads revolving around the human condition, I began researching award winning novels, in that, you know, they must be good. Which brought me to Amor Towles novel A Gentleman in Moscow. It's the story of an exiled Russian aristocrat, who, after a change in the country's government, is sentenced to a life of house arrest within the walls of Moscow's stately Metropol hotel due to his writing of a controversial poem. The nearly 500-page book is evenly keeled, never too high or too low, while being charming, witty and imaginative. The story's protagonist, even in the eternal confinement of a luxury hotel, is able to embark on each day and passing year with an optimistic intelligence and unquenchable zeal for a fulfilling life interacting with the hotel's staff and guests. Adding to my enjoyment of this leisure read, was the recent news that the book is scheduled to be released as a streamable series at the end of March 2024. DEAD MAN'S HAND by JAMES J. BUTCHER



All Grimshaw Griswald Grimsby has ever wanted is to be an Auditor, one of the elite magical cops that police the world of witches and monsters. But he lost that opportunity when he failed his evaluation and flunked Auditor training. Now, the evaluator who sunk his chances has been murdered and somehow, Grimsby's on the hook for it. He'll have to team up with the world's most terrifying enforcer, step into the dangerous Elsewhere, solve a murder, and find a cursed box. This book is a wild ride from start to finish! Jim Butcher's son James rises to match his father's legacy with an urban fantasy that makes you laugh one minute and bite your nails the next. The world Butcher has created is at once mundane and extraordinary, peopled with complex characters you root for even while you wince at their mistakes. Full of humor both wry and slap stick, fast paced action that keeps you glued to the page, and moments of poignant humanity, "Dead Man's Hand" is an excellent choice for modern fantasy fans.

A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism, *The Women* is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era.
