A touching and deeply funny debut about starting over sober only to discover life's biggest messes are still waiting right where you left them.




The daughter of an affluent Black family pieces together the connection between a childhood tragedy and a beloved heirloom. A multi-generational epic that examines how the past informs our present.



STAFF PICK: Jess SONG OF A BLACKBIRD BY Maria Van Lieshout

If you think there is nothing left to learn about WWII, I encourage you to read Song of a Blackbird by Maria van Leishout. This teen graphic novel not only sports beautifully unique artwork, but contains a powerful message of the dangers of propaganda. Based on true events, the story follows Annick, a teenage girl who helps her grandmother locate a donor for a much-needed bone marrow transplant. As Annick unlocks her grandmother's unknown story, she learns of the Dutch resistance fighters and their experience with the art vs. propaganda of the Nazi regime. The story switches between two timelines as Annick and her grandmother discover a hidden past, family history, and the power of art. It sends a powerful message that resonates even in today's political situations. I recommend it to all readers.

Inspired by the CWPL 52 in 2025 challenge, I picked up The Clover Girls by Viola Shipman. This book fits the "set in Michigan" prompt. The story begins at a Northern Michigan summer camp in 1985 where four girls from different worlds come together at camp and become best friends. Their friendship lasts 4 summers, until it all comes apart. Now the women are nearing middle age and faced with struggles of adulthood when they receive terrible news that has a chance to bring them back together for one camp experience. Will their time together repair broken friendships or solidify their divide? The Clover Girls is a story of friendship set in the idyllic backdrop of Northern Michigan. Fans of early works by Kristin Hannah, Susan Mallery, and Nicholas Sparks should really enjoy this book. One of my favorite parts was recognizing the real Michigan landmarks and businesses that are highlighted! This was my first Viola Shipman book, but I am looking forward to trying more.


MARCH IS READING MONTH - COME CELEBRATE WITH US!
