
The Reading List by Sara Nisha Adams - An unforgettable and heartwarming debut about how a chance encounter with a list of library books helps forge an unlikely friendship between two very different people in a London suburb.

The Dearly Beloved by Cara Wall - This "moving portrait of love and friendship set against a backdrop of social change" traces two married couples whose lives become entangled when the husbands become co-pastors at a famed New York city congregation in the 1960s.

The Book of Lost Friends by Lisa Wingate - a dramatic historical novel of three young women searching for family amid the destruction of the post—Civil War South, and of a modern-day teacher who learns of their story and its vital connection to her students' lives.

Where the Lost Wander by Amy Harmon - In this epic and haunting love story set on the Oregon Trail, a family and their unlikely protector find their way through peril, uncertainty, and loss.
