



THE BOOKS WE'RE MOST EXCITED ABOUT THIS MONTH:



A stunning debut about loss, isolation, folklore, and the joy and dissonance of finding oneself. In 1938, a dead whale washes up on the shores of a remote Welsh island. For Manod, who has spent her whole life on the island, it feels like both a portent of doom and a symbol of what may lie beyond the island's shores. The arrival of English ethnographers who hope to study the island culture, then, feels like a boon to her—both a glimpse of life outside her community and a means of escape. O'Connor paints a portrait of a community and a woman on the precipice, forced to confront an outside world that seems to be closing in on them.



Lawrence Ingrassia delivers an intimate, gripping tale that sits at the intersection of memoir and medical thriller. Ingrassia lost his mother, two sisters, brother, and nephew to cancer—different cancers developing at different points throughout their lives. And while highly unusual, his family is not the only one to wonder whether their heartbreak is the result of unbelievable bad luck, or if there might be another explanation.

HAUNTING DYSTOPIAN READS



Reminiscent of the works of Margaret Atwood, Shirley Jackson, and Octavia Butler, a biting social commentary from the acclaimed author of <u>Lakewood</u> that speaks to our times--a piercing dystopian novel about the unbreakable bond between a young woman and her mysterious mother, set in a world in which witches are real and single women are closely monitored. In <u>The</u> <u>Women Could Fly</u>, Megan Giddings explores the limits women face--and the powers they have to transgress and transcend them.



Set in a not-too-distant America, <u>I Cheerfully</u> <u>Refuse</u> is the tale of Rainy, an aspiring musician setting sail on Lake Superior in search of his departed, deeply beloved, bookselling wife. An endearing bear of an Orphean narrator, he seeks refuge in the harbors, fogs, and remote islands of the inland sea. After encountering lunatic storms and rising corpses from the warming depths, he eventually lands to find an increasingly desperate and illiterate people, a malignant billionaire ruling class, a crumbled infrastructure, and a lawless society.

MANTON BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE

The Friends of the Manton Library and the City of Manton are working hard to create a new library location in Manton! Located in the same small residence for decades, the current Manton Library is aging rapidly. With the increase in library usage, the community needs a building in which staff can hold events, welcome public meetings, and curate a larger book collection. The new library building is in the works! Located on the site of the old VFW Hall at 603 State Street, the new library will have more space for books, dedicated rooms for teens and kids, meeting room space, and an area dedicated to Manton history. The City and Friends hope to break ground this summer!

The Cadillac and Mesick Libraries now have seed libraries! Stop by one of these library locations and receive a few packets of free seeds to start your garden this summer. Seed libraries encourage crop diversity and self-sufficiency. Seeds are available for flowers, vegetables, and herbs depending on the location.

The Cadillac Library and it's branch locations will be closed for Memorial Day weekend, May 25th - May 27th.
