



CATHERINE AIREY





STAFF PICK: Andie <u>I, ROBOT</u> by Isaac Asimov

There are many science fiction authors out there, but one of my favorites is Isaac Asimov. I think his works; which delve into robotics, AI's(Artificial Intelligences), and the understanding of sentience are important now more than ever as we enter into an age with Artificial Intelligences, smart cars, and other robotic technological advances. <u>I</u>, <u>Robot</u> is a great starter book for Asimov's works for several reasons. First, the book itself is a giant interview with the retiring head of a Robot Company. It gives a great overview on the evolution of robots and many of its chapters can be read as short stand alone short stories. Second, the book also introduces the importance of Isaac Asimov's three rules of Robotics. Finally, the book begins the journey of questioning the idea of sentient existence, a common theme in several of Isaac Asimov's works. It is a book I enjoy re-reading time and time again and one I hope others may like as they enter the world of science fiction.
