

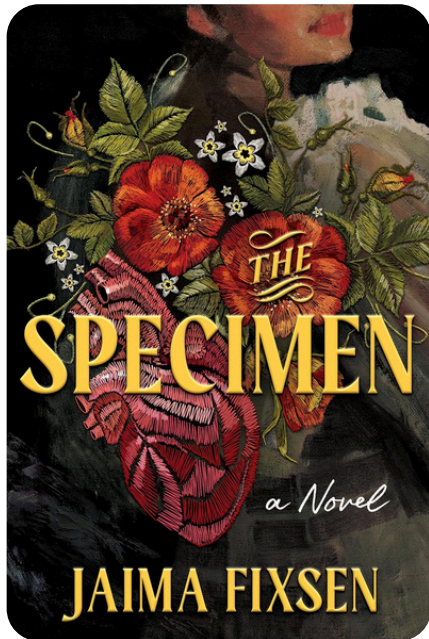

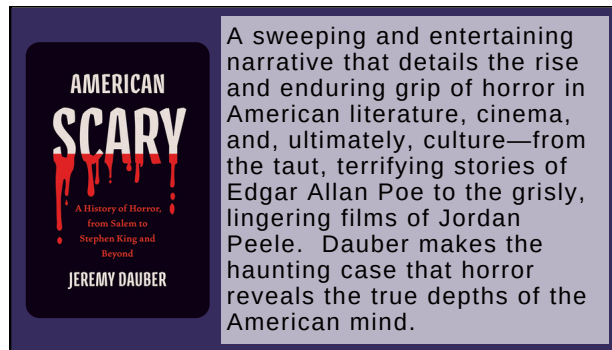

THE BOOKS WE'RE MOST EXCITED ABOUT THIS MONTH:



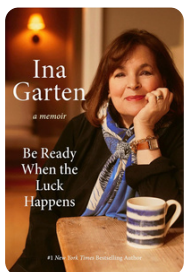

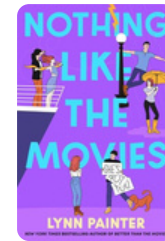
PARENT TEEN CRAFT NIGHT:

COUNTDOWN
BIN LADEN

The second book in Chris Wallace's "Countdown" series dives into the roughly eight-month time period from late summer 2010 to early spring 2011 when the CIA was near certain they finally had a precise location of Osama bin Laden. Focusing on key figures within the CIA, the defense department, the Obama Administration, elite Navy Seal fighters, and others, Countdown bin Laden reads like a fast-paced fiction thriller, while outlining a very real and important event in our country's history. The author uses his political and media connections to interview many of the main characters in this story, adding a level of detail never before known. Beginning with the moment CIA agents bring the suspected location of bin Laden to their director, all the way through the heart stopping minutes of the actual Seal Team Six raid, this book both informs and entertains from start to finish. Anyone who lived through and remembers the decade after 9/11 will want to check out this excellent book!

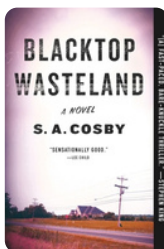
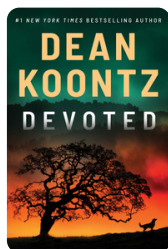
LIBRARY NEWS
