LIBRARY NEWS

FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY USED BOOK SALE. Stop by our Community Room Thursday, Oct. 9th - Saturday, Oct. 11th for the sale.

THE CADILLAC WEXFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY OFFERS FREE ACCESS TO eBOOKS, e-AUDIOBOOKS, AND eMAGAZINES through two platforms: Libby and Hoopla. The cost of these services are generated in two different ways. With Libby, the Library is part of the Up North Digital catalog, a pool of books shared between 38 libraries. Each library pays based on their populations and their use of the collection in the previous year. Libraries can also choose to spend extra funds in Libby to give their patrons first access to titles. In 2024, CWPL spent \$10,914.29 for the shared titles and an added \$3,000 on additional audio books, for a total of \$13,914.29. In return, patrons checked out 35,945 items. Only one person at a time may access an ebook or e-audiobook. That is why Libby users often have to wait for an item. There are only so many copies and only one person at a time may access each copy.

Hoopla works differently. Every time a library patron accesses an item on Hoopla, the library pays a small fee for the checkout, between \$0.99 and \$3.99. There is no limit on the number of people who may access an item at one time. If 50 people want to read "Camino Winds" they can, as long as the library can afford to pay the access fee. The library has a yearly budget for Hoopla and to make sure that budget lasts over the year, it also has monthly and daily budgets. In 2024, the library spent \$10,471.04 in Hoopla or \$28.69 per day (7 to 28 check outs). When the daily budget is met, patrons can no longer check out items on Hoopla. The total number of items accessed in 2024 was 4,586 ebook, e-audiobooks, tv, music, and movies.

Let's compare the two:

Libby: 35,945 checkouts-Cost \$13,914.29- Ave. cost/checkout \$0.39 **Hoopla:** 4,586 checkouts-Cost \$ 10,471.04- Ave. cost/checkout \$2.28

We understand that some people prefer the instant access of Hoopla to trying to manage holds in Libby. They may ask, "Why can't the library just spend more money in Hoopla?". That's a good question. In an ideal world, the library would love to give unlimited access to materials to our patrons! But that access is not free and part of our responsibility is to be good stewards of the funds that have been entrusted to us. The money spent in Libby provides much more value to our patrons.

The library wants to serve people efficiently but also in ways that work for them. You may notice some changes to Hoopla over the last months of 2025 as we try out options. Please understand these changes are our attempt to serve as many people as possible with the money available to us.

Did you know the library has its own book clubs you can join?


